
Connection to Outside Community

Your connection to culture, history, and identity at Pomonok; how close you live to amenities that are relevant to your identity or culture.




Walkability + Accessibility

The condition of benches, sidewalks, playgrounds or planted areas; the level of wear and tear of outdoor furniture and streetscapes.

Environment that promotes healthy living, where you have the opportunities to play, be active, relax, and self reflect.



Programs + Events

Events that happen within the campus or community where you are exposed to art, culture or other activities, is it for families, teens or children?



Gathering + Socializing

Areas that allow you to gather with friends and family, both formally and informally.




Sports + Recreation
